### ANIMAL HEALTH ACT 1995

#### Section 18

#### *General Authority for the Importation of South American Camelids*

I, RODERICK ANDREWARTHA, Chief Veterinary Officer, hereby issue a General Authority for the importation of South American Camelids.



The following conditions apply:—

1. The animals must be inspected by the owner or person in charge within 7 days prior to movement to Tasmania, and found free of signs of disease.
2. The animals must not be known or suspected of being infected with or exposed to a List A or List B disease within the last 30 days.
3. The herd of origin must not be subject to any animal movement restrictions.
4. The animals must be free of cattle tick (*Rhipicephalus microplus*).
5. The owner or person in charge of the animals in the exporting State or Territory must certify within 7 days prior to movement to Tasmania that, to the best of their knowledge, all the above conditions have been met.
6. All certification must be in a form approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer, and must be presented to an inspector when the animals arrive in Tasmania.

#### ANIMAL HEALTH ACT 1995

##### Section 18

##### *General Authority for the Importation of Bees and Bee Products*

I, RODERICK ANDREWARTHA, Chief Veterinary Officer, hereby issue a General Authority for the importation of Bees and Bee Products.

The following conditions apply:—

1. Queen bees and escort bees may be imported provided that;
  - (a) they are in new queen cages; and
  - (b) the escort bees have been hand caught; and
  - (c) they are from apiaries with no history of infection with Small Hive Beetle (*Aethina tumida*).
2. Substances produced or collected by bees, other than bees wax and honey, may be imported without restriction.
3. Honey shall come from apiaries free of American Foul Brood (*Bacillus larvae*) and colonies (hives) not showing any clinical signs of diseases of bees.
4. Bees wax must have been melted and cooled.
5. The consignor of the bees or bee products in the exporting state or territory must certify that, to the best of their knowledge, all of the above conditions have been met.
6. All certification must be in a form approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer, and must be presented to an inspector when the animals arrive in Tasmania.

##### *General Authority for the importation of Bovine Ova and Embryos*

I, RODERICK ANDREWARTHA, Chief Veterinary Officer, hereby issue a General Authority for the Importation of Bovine Ova and Embryos.

The following conditions apply:—

1. The person responsible for the consignment must certify that all ova and embryos, were collected and processed in accordance with the procedure set out in the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) Terrestrial Animal Health Code.
2. All certification must be in a form approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer, and accompany the shipment for presentation to an inspector when the ova and/or embryos arrive in Tasmania.

#### ANIMAL HEALTH ACT 1995

##### Section 18

##### *General Authority for the importation of Bovine Semen from licensed or accredited centres, or collected outside of a licensed or accredited centre after 31 December 1998*

I, RODERICK ANDREWARTHA, Chief Veterinary Officer, hereby issue a General Authority for the Importation of Bovine Semen from licensed or accredited centres, or collected outside of a licensed or accredited centre after 31 December 1998.

The following conditions apply:—

1. The bovine semen must have been collected either at a licensed or accredited artificial breeding centre, or if not collected in a licensed or accredited artificial breeding centre must have been collected after 31 December 1998.
2. If the semen has been collected in an accredited or licensed centre;
  - (a) The person responsible for consigning the bovine semen must certify that the semen;
    - i. was collected in a licensed or accredited artificial breeding centre in Australia, or
    - ii. was imported into Australia under Australian Quarantine and Inspection Service (AQIS) bovine semen collection protocols.
3. If the semen was collected outside of a licensed or accredited centre after 31 December 1998 the person responsible for consigning the bovine semen must certify that the following conditions have been met;
  - (a) The donor's herd of origin must have existed for at least 3 years prior to semen collection. Changes of ownership or location need not disqualify the donor herd if the certifying authority is satisfied that disease monitoring of the herd has been adequate.
  - (b) The donor's herd was not subject to any movement restrictions at the time of collection.
  - (c) The semen was collected after 31 December 1998.
  - (d) The donor bull/s must **EITHER**
    - i. have had the ELISA test for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis, with negative results, no less than 42 days

- after the collection of the semen; **OR**
- ii. have been eligible for entry into Tasmania without EBL testing at the time of semen collection.
- (e) An Inspector authorised by the Chief Veterinary Officer, or a Veterinary Surgeon in the State or Territory of origin must certify that they have no reason to doubt the owner declaration for conditions a) to d).
4. All certification must be in a form approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer, and must be presented to an inspector when the semen arrives in Tasmania.

3. The herd of origin must not be subject to any animal movement restrictions.
4. The owner or person in charge of the animals in the exporting State or Territory must certify within 7 days prior to movement to Tasmania that, to the best of their knowledge, all the above conditions have been met.
5. All certification must be in a form approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer, and must be presented to an inspector when the animals arrive in Tasmania.

#### ANIMAL HEALTH ACT 1995

##### Section 18

##### *General Authority for the Importation of Cattle*

I, RODERICK ANDREWARTHA, Chief Veterinary Officer, hereby issue a General Authority for the Importation of Cattle.

The following conditions apply:—

1. The cattle must be inspected by the owner or person in charge within 7 days prior to movement to Tasmania and found free of signs of disease.
2. The cattle must not be known or suspected of being infected with, or exposed to a List A or List B disease, other than Bovine Johne's Disease, within 42 days prior to movement to Tasmania commencing.
3. The herd of origin must not be subject to any animal movement restrictions, other than restrictions for Bovine Johne's Disease.
4. The herd or herds of origin must have existed for at least 3 years prior to export. Changes of ownership or location need not disqualify the herd or herds if the certifying authority is satisfied that the disease monitoring of the herd or herds has been adequate.
5. All cattle;
  - (a) that are weaned from their dam, or more than 12 weeks old, must be tested for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis with the ELISA test within 42 days before shipment with negative results. Serum samples may be tested in pools of up to 10. For milk samples pools of up to 30 may be used OR;
  - (b) Cattle which are all beef breeds originating from South Australia, Western Australia (excluding the Tick Infected Area), Victoria or New South Wales (excluding North Coast Livestock Health and Pest District), and have had no contact with dairy or dairy cross cattle in the previous 3 years, are exempt from EBL testing.
6. Cattle being imported must either be:
  - (a) Dairy cattle from a dairy herd accredited in a program approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer of the exporting State or Territory as Bulk Milk Test Negative or better according to the national guidelines for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis control; or
  - (b) Beef or beef/dairy cross cattle from a beef herd in which there has been no evidence of Enzootic Bovine Leucosis infection in the last 3 years.
7. Cattle imported to Flinders Island must be either:
  - (a) from a Bovine Johne's disease Protected Zone or Free Zone; or
  - (b) from a Beef Only, Check Tested or herd of higher status under the National Johne's Disease Program Standard Definitions and Rules – for Cattle.
8. Cattle from herds classified as Bovine Johne's Disease Suspect or Infected may be introduced into Tasmania (other than Flinders Island), providing the purchaser or recipient, has been advised of the Bovine Johne's Disease status of the herd of origin.
9. The owner or person in charge of the animals in the exporting State or Territory must certify within 7 days prior to movement to Tasmania that, to the best of their knowledge, all the above conditions have been met.
10. A Stock Inspector or Government Veterinary Officer in the state of origin must certify that after due enquiry, they have no reason to doubt the 'owner declaration' required by condition 9.
11. All certification must be in a form approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer, and must be presented to an inspector when the animals arrive in Tasmania.

*General Authority for the Importation of Goats*

I, RODERICK ANDREWARTHA, Chief Veterinary Officer, hereby issue a General Authority for the Importation of Goats to Tasmania.

The following conditions apply:—

1. The goats must be inspected by the owner or person in charge within 7 days prior to movement to Tasmania, and be found free of signs of disease.

    - i. a Bovine Johne's Disease Protected or Free Zone, according to the current *National Johne's Disease Program - Standard Definitions and Rules for Cattle*, applying at the time of export; or
    - ii. a Control Zone as defined by the *National Johne's Disease Program - Standard Definitions and Rules for Cattle* and the flock/herd is Check Test negative or better, according to the current *National Johne's Disease Program - Standard Definitions and Rules for Cattle*; or

6. Goats consigned to all parts of Tasmania other than Flinders Island, must not be subject to any animal movement restrictions other than restrictions for Johne's Disease.
7. Goats from herds classified as Johne's Disease suspect or infected may be introduced into Tasmania (other than Flinders Island), providing the purchaser or recipient has been advised of the Johne's Disease status of the herd of origin.
8. The goats must be free of cattle tick (*Rhipicephalus microplus*).
9. The owner or person in charge of the animals in the exporting State or Territory must certify within 7 days prior to movement to Tasmania that, to the best of their knowledge, all the above conditions have been met.

##### (1) *Justices Amendment Rules (No. 2) 2009*
