Regulatory Impact Statement: Property Agents and Land Transactions Amendment Regulations 2022

The Department of Justice has prepared a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) in respect of proposed new subordinate legislation to amend the Property Agents and Land Transactions Regulations 2017 (the Principal Regulations).

The objects of the draft Property Agents and Land Transactions Amendment Regulations 2022 are to increase annual licence fees for property agents to ensure the viability of the Property Agents Board, and make a necessary amendment to facilitate the proclamation of the *Property Agents and Land Transactions Amendment Act 2020*.
