(2) Daylight Saving Regulations 2008

These regulations prescribe the period during which Tasmanian summer time is to be observed in this State.

(3) Gas Pipelines (Transmission Pipeline) Amendment Order 2008

This order amends the *Gas Pipelines (Transmission Pipeline) Order 2001* by providing that a certain pipeline for the delivery of gas to Gunns Limited is to be treated as a transmission pipeline for the purposes of the *Gas Pipelines Act 2000*.

(4) Proclamation under section 2 of the Supreme Court Amendment Act 2007

This proclamation fixes 1 March 2008 as the day on which the *Supreme Court Amendment Act 2007* commences.

(5) Vocational Education and Training Amendment Regulations 2008

MARINE AND SAFETY (FEES) AMENDMENT BY-LAWS 2008

UNDER the powers conferred on it by the *Marine and Safety Authority Act 1997*, the Marine and Safety Authority makes the following by-laws:—

Short title

1.—These by-laws may be cited as the Marine and Safety (Fees) Amendment By-Laws 2008.
