GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) Proclamation under section 2 of the Housing Indemnity Amendment Act 2008

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2008 as the day on which the provisions of the *Housing Indemnity Amendment Act 2008* commence.

(2) Fisheries (General and Fees) Amendment Regulations 2008

These regulations amend the Fisheries (General and Fees) Regulations 2006 by -

- (a) prescribing the renewal and transfer fees for fishing licences (southern calamari); and
- (b) prescribing the renewal and quota unit transfer fees for fishing licences (banded morwong); and
- (c) updating the circumstances in which the concessional fee is available on transfer of a fishing licence (vessel); and
- (d) reducing the fees payable for the purchase of rock lobster tags.
 - (3) Proclamation under section 2 of the National Gas (Tasmania) Act 2008

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2008 as the day on which the provisions of the National Gas (Tasmania) Act 2008 commence.

(4) Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Amendment (Vehicle Registration Fees) Regulations 2008
These regulations amend the Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2000 by increasing the motor vehicle registration fee payable by eligible pensioners from 33 to 34 fee units.

HOUSING INDEMNITY AMENDMENT ACT 2008

NOTICE TO BUILDERS

Pursuant to Section 9_B(3) of the Housing Indemnity Amendment Act 2008 Changes to the Housing Indemnity Act 1992 from 1 July 2008

RECENT changes to the Housing Indemnity Act 1992 apply to builders and owner builders from 1 July 2008.

- · The changes mean that builders will no longer be required to take out housing indemnity insurance. This applies to builders undertaking building work for consumers and to owner builders intending to sell homes from 1 July 2008.
- Builders must give consumers an information sheet entitled 'Are You Building or Renovating a Home? A Consumer Guide'. This document must be provided if the cost of the building work is to be more than \$12,000.
