GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *Passenger Transport (Transitional) Amendment Regulations 2008*

These regulations amend the *Passenger Transport (Transitional) Regulations 2000* by revising the definition of “transitional period”.

(2) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Amendment Act 2004*

This proclamation fixes 18 June 2008 as the day on which the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Amendment Act 2004* commences.

(3) *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Diving Safety) Regulations 2008*

These regulations—

- (a) provide for the safety of divers involved in offshore petroleum operations; and
- (b) mirror the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Diving Safety) Regulations 2002* of the Commonwealth and corresponding legislation of other States.

(4) *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Management of Safety on Offshore Facilities) Regulations 2008*

These regulations –

- (a) provide for the safe construction, installation, operation, modification and decommissioning of offshore petroleum facilities (other than pipelines); and
- (b) replace the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Management of Safety on Offshore Facilities) Regulations 2002*; and
- (c) mirror the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Management of Safety on Offshore Facilities) Regulations 1996* of the Commonwealth and corresponding legislation of other States.

(5) *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Occupational Health and Safety) Regulations 2008*

These regulations–

- (a) provide for the occupational health and safety of workers on offshore petroleum facilities; and
- (b) mirror the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Occupational Health and Safety) Regulations 1993* of the Commonwealth and corresponding legislation of other States.

(6) *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Pipelines) Regulations 2008*

These regulations–

- (a) provide for the consents required to construct or operate a pipeline for use in an offshore petroleum operation; and
- (b) provide for the preparation, acceptance, and revision of pipeline management plans and pipeline safety management plans; and
- (c) replace the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Pipelines) Regulations 2002*; and
- (d) mirror the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) (Pipelines) Regulations 2001* of the Commonwealth and corresponding legislation of other States.
