Building and Construction Industry (Security of Payment) Bill 2009

YOUR comment is invited on the *Building and Construction Industry (Security of Payment) Bill 2009 (The Bill)*.

The objective of the Bill is to improve payment practices in the building and construction industry to ensure progress payments are made in a timely manner.

The legislation establishes an entitlement for people who carry out construction work (or who supply related goods or services) to timely payment for their work and the goods and services they supply.

The legislation uses an 'adjudicator' to ensure that speedy and efficient progress payments are made during the course of a contract without resorting to time consuming and costly arbitration or litigation.

The legislation does not abolish arbitration and litigation in building disputes; in effect it postpones these remedies until the end of the contract. Final financial payments or restitution is determined at the end of the contract under the provisions of the contract. It maintains the progress payments under dispute and 'keeps the money flowing down the contractual chain' to parties who have a right to payment.

It is intended that the Bill will assist those parties that enter into a contract after the commencement of the Bill. Those contracts that commence prior to the enactment of the Bill will not be subject to the payment practices established in the Bill.

*Environmental Management and Pollution Control
(Underground Petroleum Storage Systems) Regulations 2009*

CALL FOR PUBLIC SUBMISSIONS

THE Environment Division of the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment invites written submissions on the proposed *Environmental Management and Pollution Control (Underground Petroleum Storage Systems) Regulations 2009*.

In accordance with the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*, a Regulatory Impact Statement has been prepared to explain the likely impact of the draft regulations.

The aim of the Regulations is to require the owners and operators of Underground Petroleum Storage Systems (UPSS) to put in place measures to prevent or limit the release of petroleum products from the UPSS into the environment, thereby protecting soil and groundwater resources.

It is intended that the proposed regulations will meet the following objectives:

- to proactively prevent contamination through the adoption of best practice environmental management;
- to reduce the risk of leaks occurring by requiring minimum construction standards for new (and upgraded) infrastructure;
- to enable the early detection of leaks by requiring loss monitoring and the installation of groundwater wells in certain situations;
- to ensure that UPSS are decommissioned appropriately;
- to create a level playing field by requiring compliance by all UPSS owners/operators;
- to allow penalties for non-compliance to apply;
- to ensure that leaks are investigated and environmental harm is reported.

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *Poisons List Amendment Order (No. 2) 2009*

This order amends the *Poisons List Order 2001* by incorporating certain changes recommended by the National Drugs and Poisons Schedule Committee in the Standard for the Uniform Scheduling of Drugs and Poisons No. 21, Amendment No. 2, and the Standard for the Uniform Scheduling of Drugs and Poisons No. 22, Amendment No. 3.

(2) *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 2) Amendment Order 2009*

This order amends the *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 2) 2009* by transferring the administration of the *Poisons Act 1971* in so far as it relates to the Poppy Advisory and Control Board from the Minister for Health to the Minister for Justice.

(3) *Forestry Regulations 2009*

These regulations –

- (a) prescribe the specifications that must be met by the Forestry corporation in respect of eucalypt veneer logs and eucalypt sawlogs for the purposes of section 22AA of the *Forestry Act 1920*; and
- (b) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Forestry Regulations 1999* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(4) *Gaming Control Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2009*

These regulations amend the *Gaming Control Regulations 2004* to prescribe further activities as “sports events” for the purposes of that definition in section 3(1) of the *Gaming Control Act 1993*.

(5) *Strata Titles (Insurance) Regulations 2009*

These regulations prescribe \$5 000 000 as the minimum amount of public risk insurance that a body corporate must maintain over the site for which it is responsible.

Fisheries (Scalefish) Rules 2004, Rule 9

CLOSED SEASON FOR STRIPED TRUMPETER

I, ROBERT GOTT, Director (Marine Resources), acting as per delegated authority contained in Section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*, do under Rule 9 of the *Fisheries (Scalefish) Rules 2004* hereby determine the dates of the closed season for that part of the scalefish fishery that involves the take and possession of striped trumpeter (*Latris lineata*) by any person in all State waters, including waters detailed in Section 6 on page 15 of the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette, No. S 531, 31 December 1996*:

Closed season from:

- 1 September 2009 to 31 October 2009 (inclusive); and
- 1 September 2010 to 31 October 2010 (inclusive).

This notice temporarily closes the fishery for striped trumpeter in all State waters. This includes all waters from the high water mark to the 200 nautical mile Exclusive Economic Zone limit. No person may take or be in possession of any striped trumpeter on State waters during the closed period. The closure is designed to reduce fishing effort and protect striped trumpeter during the peak spawning period.
