GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *Business Undertakings Assistance (Land Tax Rebate) Regulations 2009*

These regulations, made under the *Business Undertakings Assistance Act 1984* –

- (a) prescribe a class of business undertakings for the purposes of the Act; and
- (b) include provisions relating to applications for grants under the Act that relate to business undertakings of that class; and
- (c) provide that a landlord who receives under the Act a grant in relation to a business undertaking of that class must refund to a tenant of the landlord any amount, paid by the tenant, that is calculated by reference to land tax and that is not more than the amount of the grant.

(2) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Industrial Relations (Commonwealth Powers) Act 2009*

This proclamation fixes 1 January 2010 as the day on which the provisions of the *Industrial Relations (Commonwealth Powers) Act 2009* commence.

(3) *Passenger Transport Amendment Regulations 2009*

These regulations amend the *Passenger Transport Regulations 2000* by revising the schedule of fees prescribed for the purposes of the *Passenger Transport Act 1997*.

(4) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Road Safety (Alcohol and Drugs) Amendment Act 2009*

This proclamation fixes 1 January 2010 as the day on which the *Road Safety (Alcohol and Drugs) Amendment Act 2009* commences.

(5) Proclamation under section 7 of the *Roads and Jetties Act 1935*

This proclamation declares certain portions of certain forest roads in the north-west of the State to be subsidiary roads and classifies them as tourist roads.

(6) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Taxi and Luxury Hire Car Industries Amendment Act 2009*

This proclamation fixes 1 January 2010 as the day on which the *Taxi and Luxury Hire Car Industries Amendment Act 2009* commences.

(7) *Luxury Hire Car Industries Amendment Regulations 2009*

These regulations amend the *Luxury Hire Car Industry Regulations 2008* by –

- (a) removing the GST requirement for fees specified in the regulations; and
- (b) providing that luxury hire car licences that were not in force at the commencement of the *Taxi and Luxury Hire Car Industries Act 2008* are taken to have been issued under that Act.

(8) *Taxi Industry Amendment Regulations 2009*

These regulations amend the *Taxi Industry Regulations 2008* by –

- (a) requiring security camera video recordings to be downloaded in certain circumstances and clarifying the procedure once the recording has been downloaded; and
- (b) amending the requirements relating to the testing and sealing of taximeters; and
- (c) increasing certain penalties and fees; and
- (d) amending the requirements to make and keep certain records; and
- (e) amending certain provisions to reflect changes in terminology; and
- (f) making other miscellaneous amendments.

(9) *Traffic (Compliance and Enforcement) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2009*

These regulations amend the *Traffic (Compliance and Enforcement) Regulations 2001* by increasing the fine payable for the traffic infringement notice offence of driving while using a hand-held mobile phone.

(10) *Threatened Species Protection Order (No. 2) 2009*

This order amends the *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* by –

- (a) adding certain species to, and omitting certain species from, the Schedules of endangered, vulnerable and rare flora and fauna; and
- (b) updating certain taxonomic, authority, family and common name references in the Schedules.

(11) *Poisons List Amendment Order (No. 4) 2009*

This order amends the *Poisons List Order 2001* by incorporating changes recommended by the National Drugs and Poisons Schedule Committee in the Standard for the Uniform Scheduling of Drugs and Poisons No. 24, Amendment No. 2.
