FEE UNITS ACT 1997

THE *Fee Units Act 1997* provides for automatic changes in Government fees and charges in accordance with movements in the Hobart Consumer Price Index (CPI). #### PUBLIC NOTICE

Dates of Closed Season for Part of the Scalefish Fishery

I, GRANT PULLEN, Acting Director (Marine Resources), acting under Rule 9 of the *Fisheries (Scalefish) Rules 2004* and in accordance with delegated authority under section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995* hereby determine that the dates of the closed season for the fishery for banded morwong that involves the take or possession of banded morwong (*Cheilodactylus spectabilis*) in State waters is from 1 March 2009 to 30 April 2009, inclusive, other than for the possession of banded morwong held on a fishing vessel or in a cauf that have been recorded as 'landed' in Part B of the Scalefish Fishing Record.

#### *Information*

This notice closes the fishery for banded morwong in all State waters. No commercial or recreational fisher may take, or be in possession of, any banded morwong in State waters between 1 March 2009 and 30 April 2009. This includes the possession of banded morwong in wells or fish caufs, unless the number of banded morwong held has been recorded as 'landed' in Part B of the Scalefish Fishing Record. The full 'landed' amount recorded on the Scalefish Fishing Record will be decremented from the individual licence holder's quota balance for the east coast banded morwong fishery. The closure is necessary to:—

- Protect spawning banded morwong during a period of high vulnerability; and
- Prevent incidental mortality when held in captivity during the spawning period when they are particularly sensitive to stress.

The Central Eastern Zone being that area of State waters on the East Coast of Tasmania bounded on the north by the line of Latitude 42° 00'00" S and on the south by the line of Longitude 148° 00'00" E; and

The South Eastern Zone being that area of State waters on the East Coast of Tasmania bounded on the north by the line of Longitude 148° 00'00" E and on the south by the line of Longitude 146° 89'00" E

- are from Saturday 14 February 2009 to Sunday 24 May 2009, inclusive.

#### *Information*

**Central Eastern Zone:** Refers to area from in the vicinity of Friendly Point, to the southern tip of Tasman Island. This includes all waters on the east coast of the Tasman and Forrester Peninsulas and Blackman Bay. **Closed to take of *Heliocidaris* sea urchins.**

**South Eastern Zone:** refers to area from the southern tip of Tasman Island to Whale Head. This includes Maingon and Norfolk Bays. **Closed to take of *Heliocidaris* sea urchins.**

**Undeveloped Zone:** that area of State waters bounded by the line of Longitude 146° 89'00" E in the south and extending in a clockwise direction to the line of Latitude 42° 00'00" S (from Whale Head, up the west and along the north coasts and down to the northern border of Central Eastern Zone around Friendly Point). **Remains open for all commercial dive species.**

All the coordinates are specified in AGD66.

## FISHERIES (RESEARCH AREA) ORDER (No. 1) 2009

I MAKE the following order under section 143 of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*.

**Short title**

1. This order may be cited as the *Fisheries (Research Area) Order (No. 1) 2009*.

**Commencement**

2. This order takes effect on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

**Research area**

3. The following parts of State waters are declared to be research areas:

- (a) the part of State waters adjacent to the western side of Inner Sister Island in the Furneaux Group of Islands bounded in the north by the line of latitude 39° 41' 2.41" South, in the south by the line of latitude 39° 42' 0.31" South, in the east by the western shore of Inner Sister Island between those two lines of latitude forming the northern and southern boundaries, and in the west by an imaginary line 500 metres from the high water mark of the shore of Inner Sister Island running between those two lines of latitude forming the northern and southern boundaries (Inner Sister Island Research Area);
- (b) the part of State waters adjacent to the west coast of Tasmania near Cape Grim around The Doughboys bounded in the north by the line of latitude 40° 40' 6.65" South and in the east by the line of longitude 144° 40' 58.87" East and in the south by the line of latitude 40° 40' 24.65" South and in the west by the line of longitude 144° 40' 3.86" East (Doughboys Research Area);
- (c) (i) **for the holder of a fishing licence (abalone dive) when operating under the authority of that licence:**

The research area includes waters adjacent to the east coast of Swan Island off the north-east coast of Tasmania within an area bounded by an imaginary line starting from the point of latitude 40° 43' 49.22" South and longitude 148° 8' 0.22" East running due west to the first point of land on the east coast of Swan Island, then following the high tide mark in a generally south-easterly direction along the coast to the point on the east coast of Swan Island that is due north-west of the point of latitude 40° 44' 16.28" South and longitude 148° 7' 16.04" East, then due south-east to that point, then in a generally north-easterly direction 500 metres from the high tide mark of Swan Island to the point of origin; and

(ii) **for a person not operating under the authority of a fishing licence (abalone dive) up to and including 31 October 2009:**

The research area includes waters adjacent to the east coast of Swan Island off the north-east coast of Tasmania within an area bounded by an imaginary line starting from the point of latitude 40° 43' 49.22" South and longitude 148° 8' 0.22" East running due west to the first point of land

on the east coast of Swan Island, then following the high tide mark in a generally south-easterly direction along the coast to the point on the east coast of Swan Island that is due north-west of the point of latitude 40° 44' 16.73" South and longitude 148° 7' 45.04" East, then due south-east to that point, then in a generally north-easterly direction 500 metres from the high tide mark of Swan Island to the point of origin.

**(iii) for a person on and from 1 November 2009:**

The research area includes waters adjacent to the east coast of Swan Island off the north-east coast of Tasmania within an area bounded by an imaginary line starting from the point of latitude 40° 43' 49.22" South and longitude 148° 8' 0.22" East running due west to the first point of land on the east coast of Swan Island, then following the high tide mark in a generally south-easterly direction along the coast to the point on the east coast of Swan Island that is due north-west of the point of latitude 40° 44' 16.28" South and longitude 148° 7' 16.04" East, then due south-east to that point, then in a generally north-easterly direction 500 metres from the high tide mark of Swan Island to the point of origin (Swan Island Research Area).

- (d) the part of State waters adjacent to the west coast of King Island around Waterwitch reef bounded in the north by the line of latitude 39° 52' 54.55" South and in the east by the line of longitude 143° 48' 54.53" East and in the south by the line of latitude 39° 53' 54.67" South and in the west by the line of longitude 143° 47' 54.77" East (Waterwitch Reef Research Area).

**Restrictions on taking fish in the research area**

4. The following restrictions on fishing are declared to apply in the research areas referred to in clause (3).

- (a) A person must not take any fish by diving or swimming beneath the surface of the research areas; and
- (b) must not enter the research areas for the purpose of diving or swimming beneath the surface.

**Revocation**

5. The *Fisheries (Research Area) Order 2001* published in the *Gazette* on the 27 June 2001 and the *Fisheries (Research Area) Order 2002* published in the *Gazette* on 25 September 2002 are rescinded.

**Explanatory Note**

This Order replaces that for the existing research areas at Inner Sister Island, The Doughboys, Swan Island and Waterwitch Reef.

#### GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

##### (1) Proclamation under section 3 of the *Highways Act 1951*

This proclamation –

- (a) notifies the dedication of certain land of the Crown near Pontville as a highway; and
- (b) notifies the boundaries of that highway.

##### (2) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Poisons Amendment (Poppy Advisory and Control Board) Act 2008*

This proclamation fixes 15 February 2009 as the day on which the *Poisons Amendment (Poppy Advisory and Control Board) Act 2008* commences.

##### (3) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Water Legislation Amendment Act 2008*

This proclamation fixes 11 February 2009 as the day on which the provisions of the *Water Legislation Amendment Act 2008* commence.

##### (4) *Water Management Amendment Regulations 2009*

These regulations amend the *Water Management Regulations 1999* consequent on the enactment of the *Water Legislation Amendment Act 2008*.

##### (5) *Water Management (Electoral and Polling) Regulations 2009*

These regulations provide for the conduct of trust membership elections and trust borrowing polls under the *Water Management Act 1999*.

(6) *Water Management (Watercourse Authority Exemption) Order 2009*

This order declares that Part 6A of the *Water Management Act 1999* does not apply to certain water entities.

(7) *Water Management (Well Driller's Licence Exemption) Order 2009*

This order exempts certain categories of well works from the operation of Division 4 of Part 7 of the *Water Management Act 1999*.

(8) *Water Management (Well Works Permit Exemption) Order 2009*

This order declares that, until 1 September 2009, a well works permit is not required for any class of well works.
