A PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency THE HONOURABLE PETER GEORGE
UNDERWOOD, Companion of the Order of Australia,
Governor in and over the State of Tasmania and its
Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Constitution Act 1934* it is provided that the Governor shall call the Parliament of Tasmania together for the despatch of business after every general election of members of the Assembly, within 90 days after the dissolution of the Assembly, unless the Governor, by proclamation, shall extend the time for so doing by such further period not exceeding 30 days as he may think necessary

AND WHEREAS the Assembly was dissolved on 12 February 2010 and a general election of members of the Assembly was held on 20 March 2010

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that I call Parliament together for the despatch of business as soon as practicable:

NOW THEREFORE I, THE HONOURABLE PETER GEORGE UNDERWOOD, Companion of the Order of Australia, Governor in and over the State of Tasmania and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, exercising the power and authority vested in me, do hereby fix 11.00 am on Tuesday 4 May 2010, in the Houses of Parliament situated in the City of Hobart in Tasmania, as the time and place that the said Parliament shall assemble for the despatch of business; and the members of the said Parliament are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.
