GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) Proclamation under section 2(1) of the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (Tasmania) Act 2010*

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2010 as the day on which the provisions of the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (Tasmania) Act 2010*, other than sections 9 and 11, commence.

(2) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (Tasmania) (Consequential Amendments) Act 2010*

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2010 as the day on which the provisions of the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (Tasmania) (Consequential Amendments) Act 2010* commence.

(3) *Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Amendment Regulations 2010*

These regulations amend the *Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2010* by –

- (a) increasing, from 60 fee units to 61 fee units, the fee for 12 months' registration of a motor vehicle with a maximum loaded mass exceeding 4.5 tonnes; and
- (b) providing for transitional matters consequent on the commencement of the *Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2010*; and
- (c) correcting certain legislative references and making other minor amendments.

(4) *Traffic (Compliance and Enforcement) Amendment Regulations 2010*

These regulations amend the *Traffic (Compliance and Enforcement) Regulations 2001* by revising the schedule of traffic infringement notices in line with the commencement of the *Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2010*.

(5) *Sale of Hazardous Goods Regulations 2010*

These regulations–

- (a) provide that the presiding member of the committee that makes an order prohibiting or placing restrictions or conditions on the sale of a product is a party to the proceedings on any review of that order; and
- (b) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Sale of Hazardous Goods Regulations 2000* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(6) *Electricity Supply Industry (Price Control) Amendment Regulations 2010*

These regulations amend the *Electricity Supply Industry (Price Control) Regulations 2003* by –

- (a) removing the requirement for the Regulator to conduct transmission revenue cap investigations and determinations in respect of Transend; and
- (b) providing for the establishment of a contractual relationship between Hydro Tasmania and Aurora Energy and setting out the manner by which the terms and conditions of that relationship are to be established; and
- (c) revising the principles the Regulator is to give effect to when making a determination regulating the prices that electricity entities may charge in relation to retail services to be provided to non-contestable customers, so as to include an estimate of electricity supply costs; and
- (d) rescinding certain provisions that are no longer required.
