PUBLIC NOTICE - DATES OF CLOSING OF THE COMMERCIAL BLACKLIP ABALONE FISHERY IN STATE WATERS OF THE NORTH-WEST AND NORTH-EAST COASTS OF TASMANIA

I, ROBERT GOTT, Director (Marine Resources), acting under Rule 9 of the *Fisheries (Abalone) Rules 2009*, and delegated authority under Section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*, hereby determine that the dates of the closed season for the commercial abalone fishery for the taking of blacklip abalone (*Haliotis rubra*) for commercial purposes from State waters off the north-west and north-east coasts of Tasmania are as follows:-

- from 22 November 2010 to 31 December 2010, inclusive;

where State waters off the north-west coast of Tasmania is defined to mean:- those State waters within an area bounded in the north by the line of latitude at 40° 17' 00" South, bounded in the south at an imaginary line from the northernmost point of Woolnorth Point to Brown Rocks and running due west to the limit of State waters, and bounded in the east by the line of longitude 145° 22' 42" East, and

State waters off the north-east coast of Tasmania is defined to mean:- those State waters within an area bounded in the west and north by an imaginary line beginning where the line of longitude 147° 27' 00" East meets the high-water mark of the north coast of the mainland of Tasmania in Anderson Bay, then running due north until its junction with the line of latitude 40° 39' South, then due east along that line of latitude to the limit of State waters, and bounded in the east by an imaginary line from the northern side of the mouth of the Great Musselroe River at Musselroe Bay running due west for 100 metres, then following the shoreline 100 metres from shore to the northernmost tip of Musselroe Point, then running due north until intersection with the line of latitude 40° 48' 00" South, and running due east to the outer limit of State waters.

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) Adoption Amendment Regulations 2010

These regulations amend the *Adoption Regulations 2006* to allow for a maximum of 3 extensions of an approval under regulation 19 of a person's suitability as a prospective adoptive parent.

(2) Proclamation under section 2(1) of the Rail Safety Act 2009

This proclamation fixes 24 November 2010 as the day on which the provisions of the Rail Safety Act 2009, except Part 23, commence.

(3) Rail Safety Regulations 2010

These regulations prescribe requirements in relation to –

- (a) the accreditation of rail transport operators; and
- (b) plans and agreements required for safety, security and emergency management of railways; and
- (c) information required to be provided; and
- (d) rail workers.
