Fisheries (Shellfish) Rules 2007, Rule 7

PUBLIC NOTICE – SETTING OF TOTAL ALLOWABLE CATCH (TAC), DETERMINING THE PARTS AND PORTIONS FROM WHICH THE TAC IS TO BE TAKEN FOR THE COMMERCIAL SHELLFISH FISHERY.

I, BRYAN GREEN, the Minister administering the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*, pursuant to section 94 of that Act and to the *Fisheries (Shellfish) Rules 2007*, Rule 7, hereby for the 2012/2013 quota period of the commercial shellfish fishery commencing 1 September 2012 and finishing 31 August 2013 inclusive:

1. Set the total allowable catch for the commercial shellfish fishery as: 65,440 kilograms of *Venerupis* clams; 13,200 kilograms of *Katelysia* cockles; and 39,000 dozen native oysters; and,
2. Determine that the parts of the commercial shellfish fishery from which the total allowable catch is to be taken are: the Georges Bay South Clam Zone; Georges Bay North Clam Zone; Ansons Bay Cockle Zone; and Georges Bay; and,
3. Determine that the portion of total allowable catch to be taken from each part of the commercial shellfish fishery is as follows:

Georges Bay South Clam Zone – 11,700 kilograms of *Venerupis* clams;

Georges Bay North Clam Zone – 53,740 kilograms of *Venerupis* clams;

Ansons Bay Cockle Zone – 13,200 kilograms of *Katelysia* cockles; and,

Georges Bay – 39,000 dozen native oysters.

Words and expressions used in this Public Notice have the same meaning as they have in the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995* and the *Fisheries (Shellfish) Rules 2007*.

PUBLIC NOTICE - DATES OF CLOSING OF THE COMMERCIAL BLACKLIP ABALONE FISHERY IN STATE WATERS AROUND THE FURNEAUX GROUP OF ISLANDS AND OFF ST HELENS ON THE EAST COAST OF TASMANIA

I, ROBERT GOTT, Director (Marine Resources), acting under Rule 9 of the *Fisheries (Abalone) Rules 2009*, and delegated authority under Section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*, hereby determine that the dates of the closed season for the commercial abalone fishery for the taking of blacklip abalone (*Haliotis rubra*) for commercial purposes from State waters around the Furneaux Group of islands and from sub-block 30A off St Helens on the east coast of Tasmania are as follows:-

- from 13 August 2012 to 31 December 2012, inclusive;

where “**State waters around the Furneaux Group of islands**” is defined to mean:- those State waters within an area bounded in the east by the line of longitude at 148° 35' 36.2" East, and bounded in the west by an imaginary line commencing at the point latitude 40° 38' 4.33" South and longitude 148° 17' 8.28" East then running generally north to the point latitude 40° 29' 3.91" South and longitude 148° 16' 58.10" East then running generally east to Passage Point then following the line of high water generally east and north to Punccheon Point then running generally north to Pot Boil Point and then following the line of high water generally north to the line of latitude 39° 45' 24.84" South, and bounded in the north by the line of latitude at 39° 45' 24.84" South, and bounded in the south by the line of latitude at 40° 38' 4.33" South;

and where “**sub-block 30A**” is defined to mean:- those State waters off St Helens on the east coast of Tasmania within an area bounded in the north by the line of latitude 41° 12' 27.10" South and bounded in the south by the line of latitude 41° 16' 32.12" South.

INFORMATION

The commercial blacklip abalone fishery in State waters on the eastern side of the Furneaux Group of islands and in sub-block 30A off St Helens is being closed from 13 August 2012 until 31 December 2012 as part of arrangements to control the total amount of blacklip abalone harvested in those areas in the interest of resource sustainability. This closed areas relate to commercial blacklip abalone fishing in fishing blocks 30A, 33B, 33C, 36A, 36B, 38A, 38B and 38C only.

LIVING MARINE RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1995

Fisheries (Biosecurity) Order (No. 1) 2012

I make the following order under section 270 of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995* issuing directions aimed at preventing the introduction or spread in State waters of a harmful disease.

1. Short title

This order may be cited as the *Fisheries (Biosecurity) Order (No. 1) 2012*.

2. Specification

This order is made in respect of the disease *abalone viral ganglioneuritis* and aims to prevent its introduction, reintroduction or spread in State waters.

3. Commencement

This order takes effect on the day it is published in the *Gazette*.

4. Directions issued

That the holder of a fish processing licence authorised to process abalone must –

- (a) prepare and furnish to the Secretary on a date as the Secretary may allow a plan for the discharge of water from each premises used to hold live abalone under the licence ("Abalone Live-holding Water Discharge Plan"); and
- (b) obtain the Secretary's approval of the Abalone Live-holding Water Discharge Plan, if necessary revising it as often and expeditiously as the Secretary may require for the purposes of conferring that approval; and
- (c) ensure that by a date as the Secretary may allow the Abalone Live-holding Water Discharge Plan is –
 - (i) implemented; and
 - (ii) operated to standard; and
- (d) ensure that, until the licensee has complied with the directions in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this clause, no live abalone taken from outside the biosecurity region are received or held at any premises used to hold live abalone under the licence; and
- (e) after obtaining the approval under paragraph (b) of this clause, furnish the Secretary with such guarantees and evidence as the Secretary, by notice to the licensee, may from time to time require to ensure that the Abalone Live-holding Water Discharge Plan is being –
 - (i) implemented; and
 - (ii) operated to standard.

5. Interpretation

(1) In this order –

“abalone” means fish of the genus *Haliotis*;

“biosecurity region” means the areas shown in Part 1, and defined in Part 2, of the Schedule to this order;

“operated”, to standard, means, in the case of treatment of abalone live-holding water –

- (a) achieving, on comparing water immediately prior to entering treatment with water immediately on leaving treatment, a minimum 3 log 10 reduction in total marine heterotrophic bacteria; and
- (b) discharging, to the marine environment, water with a discharge concentration value of ≤ 999 bacterial colony forming units per mL;

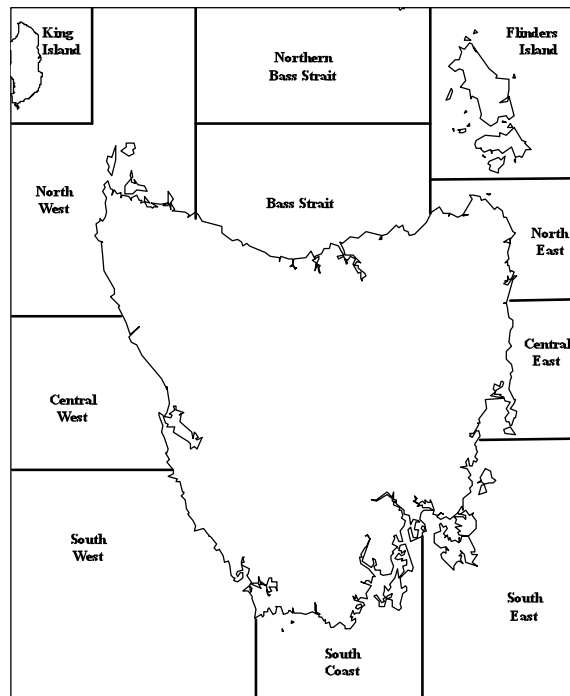
“introduction” includes reintroduction.

(2) Expressions in this order have the same meaning as in the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*.

This Order aims to prevent the introduction or spread of the disease *abalone viral ganglioneuritis*.

An Abalone Live-holding Water Discharge Plan should set out infrastructure, operating practices and monitoring procedures as part of the routine management of each premises to which it relates.

Specifically, an Abalone Live-holding Water Discharge Plan might, in addition to the treatment technology proposed, include arrangements for the following:

- the recording of live-holding water discharges;
- alerting the Department of abalone live-holding water discharges;
- the installation and operation of flow meters to measure and record all abalone live-holding water discharges;
- the daily recording of treatment levels;
- notifying the Department of any change proposed to the plan, or of any relevant change to the premises, for possible supplementary approval.
