# GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) Conveyancing Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the *Conveyancing Regulations 2005* by updating the list of conveyancing qualifications which are prescribed under the *Conveyancing Act 2004*.

(2) Coroners (Fees, Expenses and Allowances) Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the Coroners (Fees, Expenses and Allowances) Regulations 2006 by increasing the fee payable for a copy of an audio recording of proceedings under the Coroners Act 1995.

(3) Explosives Regulations 2012

These regulations, made under the *Explosives Act 2012*, prescribe various matters related to the use of explosives, including fees, infringement notice offences and penalties.

(4) Justices Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the Justices Regulations 2003 by increasing certain fees payable under the Justices Act 1959.

(5) Land Use Planning and Approvals Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the *Land Use Planning and Approvals Regulations 2004* to prescribe the requirements for a notice of modification of a planning scheme under section 14(5) of the *Land Use Planning and Approvals Act 1993* and prescribe the fee for an application for a dispensation under section 30P of that Act.

(6) Magistrates Court (Administrative Appeals Division) (Fees) Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the Magistrates Court (Administrative Appeals Division) (Fees) Regulations 2012 by increasing certain fees payable under the Magistrates Court (Administrative Appeals Division) Act 2001.

(7) Magistrates Court (Civil Division) (Fees) Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the Magistrates Court (Civil Division) (Fees) Regulations 2008 by increasing certain fees payable under the Magistrates Court (Civil Division) Act 1992 and prescribing new fees payable under that Act.

(8) Marine and Safety (Radio) Regulations 2012

These regulations provide for -

- (a) the Marine and Safety Authority to declare limited coast stations to be approved marine radio stations; and
- (b) the functions of an authorised person appointed under section 44 of the *Marine and Safety Authority Act 1997* for the purposes of these regulations.
  - (9) Mines Work Health and Safety (Supplementary Requirements) Regulations 2012

These regulations, made under the Mines Work Health and Safety (Supplementary Requirements) Act 2012 and the Work Health and Safety Act 2012 –

- (a) prescribe, for the purposes of the *Mines Work Health and Safety (Supplementary Requirements) Act 2012*, certain measures required to be taken in respect of mines, including the preparation of certain plans and systems; and
- (b) prescribe, for the purposes of the Work Health and Safety Act 2012
  - (i) that certain events are dangerous incidents; and
  - (ii) that certain decisions under these regulations are reviewable decisions; and
  - (iii) that offences against certain provisions of the *Mines Work Health and Safety (Supplementary Requirements) Act* 2012 and these regulations are infringement offences; and
  - (iv) the infringement notice penalties in respect of the infringement offences.
    - (10) Proclamation under section 17(1) of the Nature Conservation Act 2002

This proclamation -

- (a) alters the class of a certain area of reserved land under the *Nature Conservation Act 2002* from conservation area to national park; and
- (b) gives the name Southwest National Park to that reserved land.
  - (11) Proclamation under section 21(1) of the Nature Conservation Act 2002

This proclamation declares that certain land at Badger Head that is reserved land within the meaning of the *Nature Conservation Act 2002* ceases to be reserved land.

(12) Proclamation under section 21(1) of the Nature Conservation Act 2002

This proclamation declares that an area of Crown land at Stanley that forms part of The Nut State Reserve ceases to be reserved land in the class of State reserve.

(13) Property Agents and Land Transactions Amendment (Exemption) Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the *Property Agents and Land Transactions Regulations 2006* by exempting from the application of the *Property Agents and Land Transactions Act 2005*, for a specified period, certain property managers of short-term accommodation.

# (14) Radiation Protection Amendment (Disposal) Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the *Radiation Protection Regulations 2006* to introduce an approval mechanism relating to the disposal of radioactive material, and to effect minor statute law revision in relation to that matter.

(15) Residential Tenancy (Smoke Alarms) Regulations 2012

These regulations prescribe matters in relation to smoke alarms in premises to which a residential tenancy agreement relates.

(16) Proclamation under section 2 of the State Service Amendment Act 2012

This proclamation fixes 4 February 2013 as the day on which the State Service Amendment Act 2012 commences.

(17) State Service Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations amend the State Service Regulations 2011 by -

- (a) omitting the provisions relating to review panels; and
- (b) extending the circumstances in which special leave of absence may be granted; and
- (c) inserting provisions providing for timeframes in relation to reviews under section 50 of the State Service Act 2000; and
- (d) omitting references to "Commissioner" and substituting "Employer" consequent upon the enactment of the *State Service Amendment Act 2012*.
  - (18) Proclamation under section 2 of the Tasmania Together Progress Board Repeal Act 2012

This proclamation fixes 26 December 2012 as the day on which the Tasmania Together Progress Board Repeal Act 2012 commences.

(19) Work Health and Safety (Transitional) Regulations 2012

These regulations provide for savings and transitional matters consequent on the enactment of the Work Health and Safety Act 2012

(20) Conveyancing Order 2

This order extends the application of the *Conveyancing Act 2004* to contracts for the sale of land, and instruments amending contracts for the sale of land, prepared for the purposes of the *Conveyancing and Law of Property Act 1884*.


