No.1 of 2016

A By-law of the Devonport City Council, made under Section 145 of the *Local Government Act, 1993* for the purpose of amending the Amounts Payable provisions of the Parking By-law.

PART 1 - PRELIMINARY

Short Title:

1. This By-law may be cited as the Devonport City Council Amendment to the Parking By-law No. 1 of 2013.

Commencement:

2. This By-law comes into effect on 1 July 2016.

PUBLIC NOTICE - DATES OF THE CLOSED SEASON FOR PART OF THE COMMERCIAL DIVE FISHERY TO THE TAKE OF PERIWINKLES (*GENUS TURBO*) IN STATE WATERS WITHIN THE NORTHERN ZONE

RULE 12 OF THE *FISHERIES (COMMERCIAL DIVE) RULES 2011*

Pursuant to the powers under the *Fisheries (Commercial Dive) Rules 2011* ("the Rules") that were delegated to the Director (Marine Resources) on 19 August 2015 by the Minister, acting pursuant to section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995* ("the Act"), I determine that the dates of closing of State waters of the commercial dive fishery to the take of periwinkles (*Genus Turbo*) in State waters in the northern zone to the activities of the take and possession of periwinkles (*Genus Turbo*) are as follows:

from 12 May 2016 to 31 August 2016 inclusive;

where the "northern zone" is defined to mean: all State waters off the north coast of Tasmania north of an imaginary line commencing where the line of latitude 41° 00' 26" South enters the eastern limit of State waters then runs due west to the high water mark at Red Rocks then follows that line of high water approximately west to Cape Grim then runs due west to the western limit of State waters.

Any expression used in this public notice having a particular meaning under the Act or the Rules has the same meaning in this public notice as it has in the Act or the Rules.
