NOTICE OF THE MAKING OF STATUTORY RULES

IN ACCORDANCE with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act 1953, notice is given of the making of the following statutory rules:-

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT of THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) Fisheries (General and Fees) Regulations 2016

These regulations -

- (a) prescribe minimum size limits for the abalone fishery; and
- (b) prescribe the decisions that are subject to review by the Minister or Secretary; and
- (c) prescribe the determinations that are subject to appeal to the Appeal Tribunal; and
- (d) prescribe controls for the taking or possession of certain species of fish; and
- (e) prescribe noxious fish; and
- (f) prescribe other miscellaneous matters; and
- (g) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Fisheries* (*General and Fees*) Regulations 2006 under section 11 of the Subordinate Legislation Act 1992.
 - (2) Fisheries (Infringement Notices) Amendment Regulations 2016

These regulations amend the Fisheries (Infringement Notices) Regulations 2011 by –

- (a) prescribing the offences under the *Fisheries* (*General and Fees*) *Regulations 2016* for which infringement notices may be issued; and
- (b) prescribing the penalties payable for those offences; and
- (c) removing the infringement notice offences and penalties relating to the superseded *Fisheries* (*General and Fees*) *Regulations* 2006.

(3) Radiation Protection Regulations 2016

These regulations -

- (a) make provision in relation to the licensing, registration, accreditation and issue of certificates of compliance; and
- (b) make provision in relation to the storage, transport and disposal of radiation sources; and
- (c) prescribe information to be contained in radiation management plans and in registers; and
- (d) prescribe dose limits for the purposes of the Radiation Protection Act 2005; and
- (e) prescribe banned radiation sources; and
- (f) make provision in relation to fees payable under that Act; and
- (g) prescribe offences under that Act and these regulations in respect of which infringement notices may be issued and the penalties payable in respect of those offences; and
- (h) make provision in relation to other miscellaneous matters; and
- (i) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Radiation Protection Regulations 2006* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.
