ANTI-DISCRIMINATION ACT 1998

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY TASMANIA

EXEMPTION/S GRANTED

The following application for exemption from the provisions of the *Anti-Discrimination Act 1998* (Tas) (the Act) has been granted:

1. Relationships Australia Tasmania Incorporated trading as Relationships Australia Tasmania – 16/10/029 – Application for an exemption granted under section 57 of the Act for a period of three years.

This exemption has been granted to permit Relationships Australia Tasmania to recruit and employ one woman practitioner to work in the Men Engaging in New Strategies ('MENS') Program, to be based in the north of the State, to enable the program to be facilitated by a team of one man and one woman, on the basis that it is consistent with:

- a) section 25 of the Act, which provides an exception for discrimination 'for the purpose of carrying out a scheme

for the benefit of a group which is disadvantaged or has a special need because of a prescribed attribute'; and

- b) section 27(1)(d) of the Act, which provides an exception for gender discrimination 'in employment, if it is based on a genuine occupational qualification or requirement in relation to a particular position'.

Granted on the 7th day of November 2016.

The exemption is for the period of three (3) years subject to the fulfilment of the conditions that Relationships Australia Tasmania:

- a) report on or before 30 May 2017 to the Anti-Discrimination Commissioner on any actions taken in reliance on this exemption; and
- b) on at least one occasion in the 12 months immediately after this order is made, organise and promote community education for its staff, members, officers, clients and volunteers of Relationships Australia Tasmania through Equal Opportunity Tasmania's community education program to increase awareness of rights and obligations under the *Anti-Discrimination Act 1998* (Tas).

A person may apply to the Anti-Discrimination Tribunal for a review of the Commissioner's decision **within 28 days from the date of this notice being published**.

HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES AMENDMENT BY-LAW

BY-LAW 1 of 2016

BY-LAW MADE UNDER SECTION 145

OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1993

FOR THE PURPOSE OF

AMENDING THE HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES BY-LAW, NO. 1 OF 2008.

PART 1- PRELIMINARY

Short Title

1. This by-law may be cited as the Health and Environmental Services Amendment By-law.

Principal By-law

2. In this By-law, the Health and Environmental Services By-law, No. 1 of 2008 is referred to as the Principal By-law.

Clause 2 amended (Interpretation)

3. Clause 2 of the Principal By-law is amended as follows:

- a) By inserting the following definition after the definition of "backpacker accommodation":

"bee hive" means a modular framed housing for a honey bee colony, which normally contains either a nucleus colony or a standard size colony.

Clause 24 amended

4. Clause 24 of the Principal By-law is amended by omitting it and substituting the following:

24. 1) A person may keep a maximum number of bee hives specified in column 2 on land of size specified in column 1:

Column 1	Column 2
Land Size (m2)	Maximum Number of Bee Hives
<400	0
400-1000	2
1000-2000	5
2000-4000	10

- 2) A person must not keep more than the maximum number of bee hives specified in sub clause 1 without the written permission of the General Manager.

Penalty: 2 penalty units.

- 3) A person keeping bee hives must ensure:

- i. The provision of a good and sufficient water supply on the land which is readily accessible by the bees on the land;
- ii. Each bee hive is located near a screen or other barrier so as to prevent the bees flying over a thoroughfare, public place or adjoining land.

- 4) A person must not keep bee hives within 3 metres of a property boundary.

Penalty: 2 penalty units

Schedule 5 amended (Infringement Notice Offences)

5. Schedule 5 of the Principal By-Law is amended as follows:

- a) by omitting from the offence specified in clause 24(2) and substituting the following:

24(2)	Keeping of more than maximum number of bee hives without approval	0.5
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b) By inserting the following in the table after the offence specified in clause 24(2)

24(4)	Keeping bee hives within 3 metres of property boundary	0.5
24(5)	Keeping bee hives to create nuisance	0.5

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *Ambulance Service Regulations 2016*

These regulations –

- a) provide for payment to volunteers, and reimbursement to volunteer ambulance officers, in certain circumstances for ambulance services and voluntary services provided under the *Ambulance Service Act 1982*; and
- b) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Ambulance Service Regulations 2006* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(2) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Building and Construction Industry Training Fund Amendment Act 2016*

This proclamation fixes 1 January 2017 as the day on which the *Building and Construction Industry Training Fund Amendment Act 2016* commences.

(3) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Custodial Inspector Act 2016*

This proclamation fixes 16 November 2016 as the day on which the *Custodial Inspector Act 2016* commences.

(4) *Electricity Supply Industry (Pricing and Related Matters) Amendment Regulations 2016*

These regulations amend the *Electricity Supply Industry (Pricing and Related Matters) Regulations 2013* by specifying that, if the Regulator makes an approval under section 43G(1) of the *Electricity Supply Industry Act 1995* before an approval of the Minister under that section ceases to be in force, the Minister's approval ceases to be in force when the Regulator's approval comes into force.

(5) Proclamation under section 17(1) of the *Nature Conservation Act 2002*

This proclamation –

- a) alters the class of certain areas of reserved land under the *Nature Conservation Act 2002* from conservation area to national park; and
- b) gives the name Mole Creek Karst National Park to that reserved land.

(6) Poisons (Midwifery Substances) Amendment Order 2016

This order amends the *Poisons (Midwifery Substances) Order 2011* by declaring further midwifery restricted substances for the purposes of the *Poisons Act 1971*.

(7) State Service Amendment Regulations 2016

These regulations amend the *State Service Regulations 2011* by providing that Crown Solicitor is a prescribed office for the purposes of section 31(1)(b) of the *State Service Act 2000*.
