NOTICE OF THE MAKING OF STATUTORY RULES

IN ACCORDANCE with the provisions of the *Rules Publication Act 1953*, notice is given of the making of the following statutory rules:—

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *Poisons (Exempted Public Institutions) Order 2020*

This order –

- (a) specifies certain public institutions to be exempted public institutions for the purposes of section 55 of the *Poisons Act 1971*; and
- (b) revokes certain orders.

(2) *Emergency Management Act 2006*

These regulations prescribe, for the purposes of the *Emergency Management Act 2006* –

- (a) a failure to comply with a lawful requirement or direction of an emergency management worker as an offence in respect of which an infringement notice may be issued and served under that Act; and
- (b) the penalty payable under an infringement notice for that offence.

(3) *Public Health (Infringement Notices) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2020*

These regulations amend the *Public Health (Infringement Notices) Regulations 2012* by prescribing –

- (a) a failure to comply with a direction of the Director given under section 42(1) of the *Public Health Act 1997* as an offence for which an infringement notice may be issued; and
- (b) the penalty for that infringement notice offence.
