GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

- (1) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Vehicle and Traffic Amendment (Road Vehicle Standards) Act 2020*

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2021 as the day on which that Act commences.

- (2) *Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Amendment Regulations 2021*

These regulations amend the *Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2021* by providing that –

- (a) an entry in the Register of Approved Vehicles of the Commonwealth may in certain circumstances be accepted as evidence that a vehicle complies with the relevant vehicle standards; and
- (b) the registration period for a motor vehicle, as a general rule, is to be 3 months, 6 months or 12 months.

- (3) *Vehicle and Traffic (Driver Licensing and Vehicle Registration) Amendment Regulations 2021*

These regulations amend the *Vehicle and Traffic (Heavy Vehicle Charges) Regulations 2017* by revising the road component of motor tax payable for heavy vehicles.
