In accordance with the provisions of the *Rules Publication Act 1953*, notice is given of the making of the following statutory rules:-

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

- (1) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Occupational Licensing (Automatic Mutual Recognition Consequential Amendments) Act 2022*

This proclamation fixes 14 December 2022 as the day on which the provisions of that Act, other than Parts 2, 3 and 7 commence.

- (2) *Veterinary Surgeons Regulations 2022*

These regulations –

- (a) specify certain matters relating to registration under the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1987*; and
- (b) specify certain services that are not veterinary services under that Act; and
- (c) are made consequent on the repeal of the *Veterinary Surgeons Regulations 2012* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.
