PUBLISHED NOTICE – REVOCATION OF CLOSURE OF THE COMMERCIAL ROCK LOBSTER FISHERY IN THE GREAT OYSTER BAY ZONE

Rule 11(2) of the Fisheries (Rock Lobster Rules) 2011

Pursuant to the powers under the *Fisheries (Rock Lobster) Rules 2011* ("the Rules") that were delegated to me on 12 November 2018 by the Minister acting pursuant to section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995* ("the Act"), I determine that the published notice made under rule 11 of the Rules dated 26 April 2022 and published in *Gazette* No. 22 190 on 28 April 2022, which determined that the part of the commercial rock lobster fishery for the setting of rock lobster pots and the taking of rock lobster in the Great Oyster Bay Zone was to be closed from 29 April 2022, is revoked with effect on and from the date on which this notice is published in the *Gazette*.

Any expression used in this published notice having a particular meaning under the Act or the Rules has the same meaning in this published notice as it has in the Act or the Rules.
