PUBLIC NOTICE – TOTAL ALLOWABLE CATCH FOR THE ABALONE FISHERY 2023

DEFINITION OF THE PARTS OF THE ABALONE FISHERY AND THE PORTION OF THE TOTAL ALLOWABLE CATCH TO BE TAKEN IN EACH PART IN 2023

I, Joanne Lesley Palmer MLC, Minister for Primary Industries and Water administering the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*, acting under Section 94 of that Act, hereby:

1. Set the total allowable catch for the entire commercial abalone fishery for the year 2023 at 773.5 tonnes.
2. Determine that the parts of the commercial abalone fishery from which the total allowable catch for the year 2023 is to be taken are:
 - I. The eastern blacklip abalone part of the fishery; II. The western blacklip abalone part of the fishery; III. The northern blacklip abalone part of the fishery; IV. The Bass Strait blacklip abalone part of the fishery; and V. The greenlip abalone part of the fishery, those parts of the fishery being respectively identified as follows:
 - I. the eastern blacklip abalone part of the fishery is the part of the commercial abalone fishery involving only blacklip abalone in State waters adjacent to the east, south-east and south coasts of Tasmania bounded in the north by an imaginary line starting from the northern side of the mouth of the Great Musselroe River at Musselroe Bay, running due west for 100 metres, following the shoreline 100 metres from shore to the northernmost tip of Musselroe Point, running due north until intersection with the line of latitude 40° 48' 00" South and running due east to the outer limit of State waters and bounded in the south by an imaginary straight line running due south from Whale Head near South East Cape to the outer limit of State waters;
 - II. the western blacklip abalone part of the fishery is the part of the commercial abalone fishery involving only blacklip abalone in State waters adjacent to the south and west coasts of the mainland of Tasmania between an imaginary straight line due south from Whale Head near South East Cape and an imaginary straight line due west from the mouth of the Wild Wave River near Sandy Cape;
 - III. the northern blacklip abalone part of the fishery is the part of the commercial abalone fishery involving only blacklip abalone in State waters adjacent to the north, north-west and north-east coasts of the mainland of Tasmania and King Island bounded in the east by an imaginary line from the northern side of the mouth of the Great Musselroe River at Musselroe Bay running due west for 100 metres, then following the shoreline 100 metres from shore to the northernmost tip of Musselroe Point, then running due north until intersection with the line of latitude 40° 48' 00" South, and running due east to the outer limit of State waters, and bounded in the west by an imaginary straight line running due west from the mouth of the Wild Wave River near Sandy Cape to the outer limit of State waters but excluding those waters within the Bass Strait blacklip abalone part of the fishery;
 - IV. the Bass Strait blacklip abalone part of the fishery is the part of the commercial abalone fishery involving only blacklip abalone in State waters adjacent to the north coast of Tasmania, the Furneaux Group of islands, and in Bass Strait bounded in the west by an imaginary line running from the northernmost point of Woolnorth Point to the point of latitude 40° 37' 14.40" South, longitude 144° 41' 37.87" East, then running due north to the outer limit of State waters and bounded in the east by an imaginary line beginning where the line of longitude 147° 27' 00" East meets the high-water mark of the north coast of the mainland of Tasmania in Anderson Bay then running due north until its junction with the line of latitude 40° 39' South then due east along that line of latitude to the limit of State waters; and
 - V. the greenlip abalone part of the fishery is the part of the commercial abalone fishery involving only greenlip abalone.

3. Determine that the portion of the total allowable catch to be taken from each part of the commercial abalone fishery for the year 2023 is:
 - I. the eastern blacklip abalone part of the fishery – 227.5 tonnes;
 - II. the western blacklip abalone part of the fishery – 311.5 tonnes;
 - III. the northern blacklip abalone part of the fishery – 59.5 tonnes;
 - IV. the Bass Strait blacklip abalone part of the fishery – 84 tonnes; and,
 - V. the greenlip abalone part of the fishery – 91 tonnes.
4. Determine that the amount of abalone which may be taken from each part of the fishery pursuant to each abalone quota unit in the year 2023 is:
 - I. for the eastern blacklip abalone part of the fishery – 65 kilograms;
 - II. for the western blacklip abalone part of the fishery – 89 kilograms;
 - III. for the northern blacklip abalone part of the fishery – 17 kilograms;
 - IV. for the Bass Strait blacklip abalone part of the fishery – 24 kilograms; and,
 - V. for the greenlip abalone part of the fishery – 26 kilograms.

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *Administrative Arrangements Amendment Order (No. 5) 2022*

This order amends the *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 4) 2022* by removing references to the Department of Communities Tasmania and the *Homes Act 1935* and assigning administrative responsibilities in relation to the *Homes Tasmania Act 2022* and other Acts related to housing.

(2) *State Service (Restructuring) Order (No. 7) 2022*

This order restructures the State Service by –

- (a) amalgamating part of the Department of Communities Tasmania with Homes Tasmania; and
- (b) amalgamating part of the Department of Communities Tasmania with the Department of Education, Children and Young People; and
- (c) amalgamating part of the Department of Communities Tasmania with the Department of Premier and Cabinet; and
- (d) abolishing the Department of Communities Tasmania.

(3) *State Service (Agencies) Order (No. 2) 2022*

This order amends the *State Service Act 2000* so that the Department of Communities Tasmania ceases to be an Agency under that Act.

(4) *Financial Management Amendment Order (No. 2) 2022*

This order amends the *Financial Management Act 2016* by omitting from Schedule 1 references that relate to the Department of Communities Tasmania

(5) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Youth Justice Amendment (Searches in Custody) Act 2022*

This proclamation fixes 1 December 2022 as the day on which the provisions of that Act commence.

(6) *Youth Justice Amendment Regulations 2022*

These regulations under the *Youth Justice Act 1997* prescribe information, in relation to a search, that is to be included in a search register maintained under the Act.

(7) *Libraries Regulations 2022*

These regulations –

- (a) provide for the use of the property and services of the State Library Service established under the *Libraries Act 1984*; and
- (b) are made consequent on the repeal of the *Libraries Regulations 2012* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(8) *Allport Library and Museum of Fine Arts Regulations 2022*

These regulations –

- (a) provide, under the *Libraries Act 1984*, for the use of the Allport Library and Museum of Fine Arts; and
- (b) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Allport Library and Museum of Fine Arts Regulations 2012* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(9) *Interstate Transfer (Community-based Sentences) Regulations 2022*

These regulations, for the purposes of the *Interstate Transfer (Community-based Sentences) Act 2009* –

- (a) prescribe the Director, Community Corrections as a local authority for the purposes of that Act; and
- (b) declare other jurisdictions in Australia to be participating jurisdictions for the purposes of that Act; and
- (c) prescribe certain details about offenders and sentences that are to be included in the register of sentences kept by the Registrar under the Act.

(10) *Crown Lands (Shack Sites) Regulations 2022*

These regulations set the rental amount applicable for a replacement lease for a shack site under the *Crown Lands (Shack Sites) Act 1997*.

(11) *Work Health and Safety Regulations 2022*

These regulations, which replace the *Work Health and Safety Regulations 2012*, form part of a system of nationally harmonised work health and safety laws and make provision in relation to the following:

- (a) health and safety representatives;
- (b) managing risks to health and safety;
- (c) general workplace management;
- (d) hazardous work;
- (e) plant and structures;
- (f) construction work;
- (g) hazardous chemicals;
- (h) asbestos;
- (i) major hazard facilities

(12) *Work Health and Safety (Transitional) Regulations 2022*

These regulations, which replace the *Work Health and Safety (Transitional) Regulations 2012*, provide for savings and transitional matters consequent on the making of the *Work Health and Safety Regulations 2022*.



