GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *Administrative Arrangements Amendment Order (No. 2) 2024*

This order amends the *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 2) 2024* by transferring responsibility for the administration of –

- (a) certain Acts relating to Aboriginal matters from the Department of Premier and Cabinet to the Department of Natural Resources and Environment Tasmania; and
- (b) certain Acts relating to housing and planning matters from the Department of Premier and Cabinet to the Department of State Growth.

(2) *State Service (Restructuring) Order (No. 2) 2024*

This order –

- (a) amalgamates, with the Department of Natural Resources and Environment Tasmania, the part of the Department of Premier and Cabinet known as Aboriginal Heritage Tasmania; and
- (b) amalgamates, with the Department of State Growth, the parts of the Department of Premier and Cabinet known as Strategic Regional Partnerships and the State Planning Office.

(2) *Vehicle and Traffic (Heavy Vehicle Charges) Amendment Regulations 2024*

These regulations amend the *Vehicle and Traffic (Heavy Vehicle Charges) Regulations 2017* by revising the motor tax payable in respect of certain heavy vehicles.
