GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABovementIONED STATUTORY RULES

- (1) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Local Government Amendment (Code of Conduct) Act 2023*
This proclamation fixes 10 September 2024 as the day on which the provisions of that Act commence.
- (2) *Local Government (General) Amendment Regulations 2024*
These regulations amend the *Local Government (General) Regulations 2015* by –
- (a) prescribing information that is to be contained in a council’s dispute resolution policy; and
 - (b) providing that a council’s annual report must contain specified matters in relation to the council’s dispute resolution policy.
- (3) *Local Government (Code of Conduct) Order 2024*
This order –
- (a) for the purposes of the *Local Government Act 1993*, sets out the code of conduct relating to the conduct of councillors; and
 - (b) revokes the *Local Government (Model Code of Conduct) Order 2016* and *Local Government (Model Code of Conduct) Amendment Order 2018*.
